Background

- Nahata Dziil 14R Ranch is 300,000 acres ranch located in Sanders, Arizona on the Navajo Nation.
- The name 14R comes from the 14 range units, with average 18,000 acres per range unit.
- Normal grazing maximum capacity is 1,660 animal unit for 79 grazing permittees. As of 2016 only 39 permittees are active with beef program.
- Initially called Yearly Enhancement Program in 2011, started by Bill Inman.
- ND 14R Ranch Corp. was form in 2012 by partnership with different entities.
- Incorporated under Navajo Nation as Non-profit organization on June 10, 2013. IRS 501-C-3 Non Profit status in 2016,
- Award the Casino Navajo Beef People Choice Award for 2014.
- Due to increase demand for Navajo Beef, partnership with the Navajo Nation Livestock producers by doing out reach through out the big Navajo Nation.
- Currently supporting the ONHIR transition to continue to the operation utilizing PL CFR 25, Part 700 under US Government.

Mission Statement

- To support producers of source-verified, high quality Navajo Beef; educate and advocate for land and water stewardship and conservation; and to integrate modern ranching practices while preserving our traditional sustainable ways.

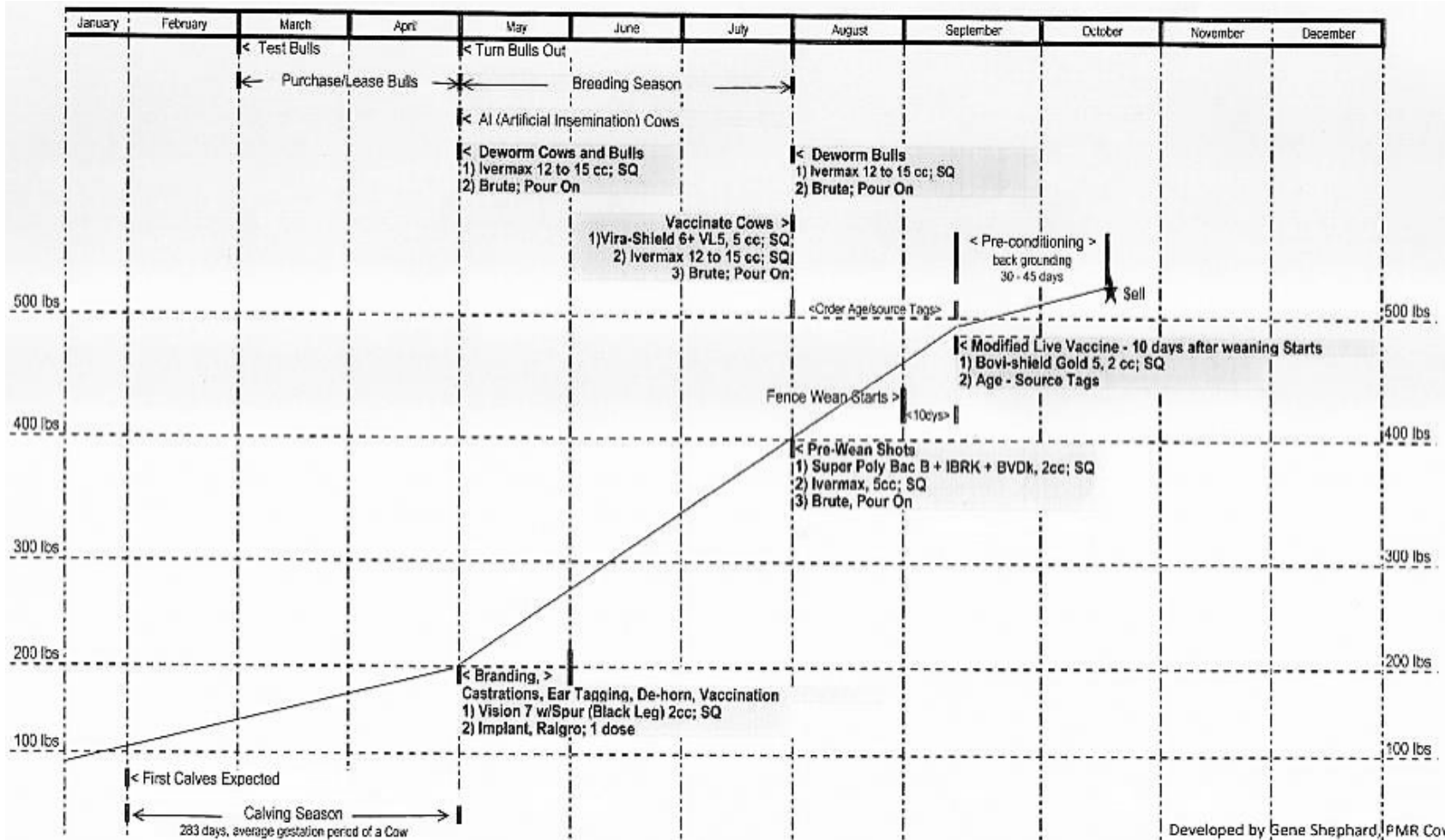


Standard Requirements for the Beef Program

1. Calf must be weaned and preconditioned for 45 days
2. Castrated, dehorned, and vaccinated
3. Record keeping requirements:
 - a) Date of birth
 - b) Vaccination records
 - c) Heavy Angus influence
 - d) Cows and Calves inventory
 - e) Brand, Brand inspection, Calf sell contract
 - f) 14R ear tags, IMI Global ear tags and calves weight
4. Calves will be evaluated and grouped accordingly by weight.
5. Cowboys helping with the required vaccinations.
6. IMI Global Age and Source Calf Certification is required by Labatt Food Service Co.



Calf Vaccination Time Line

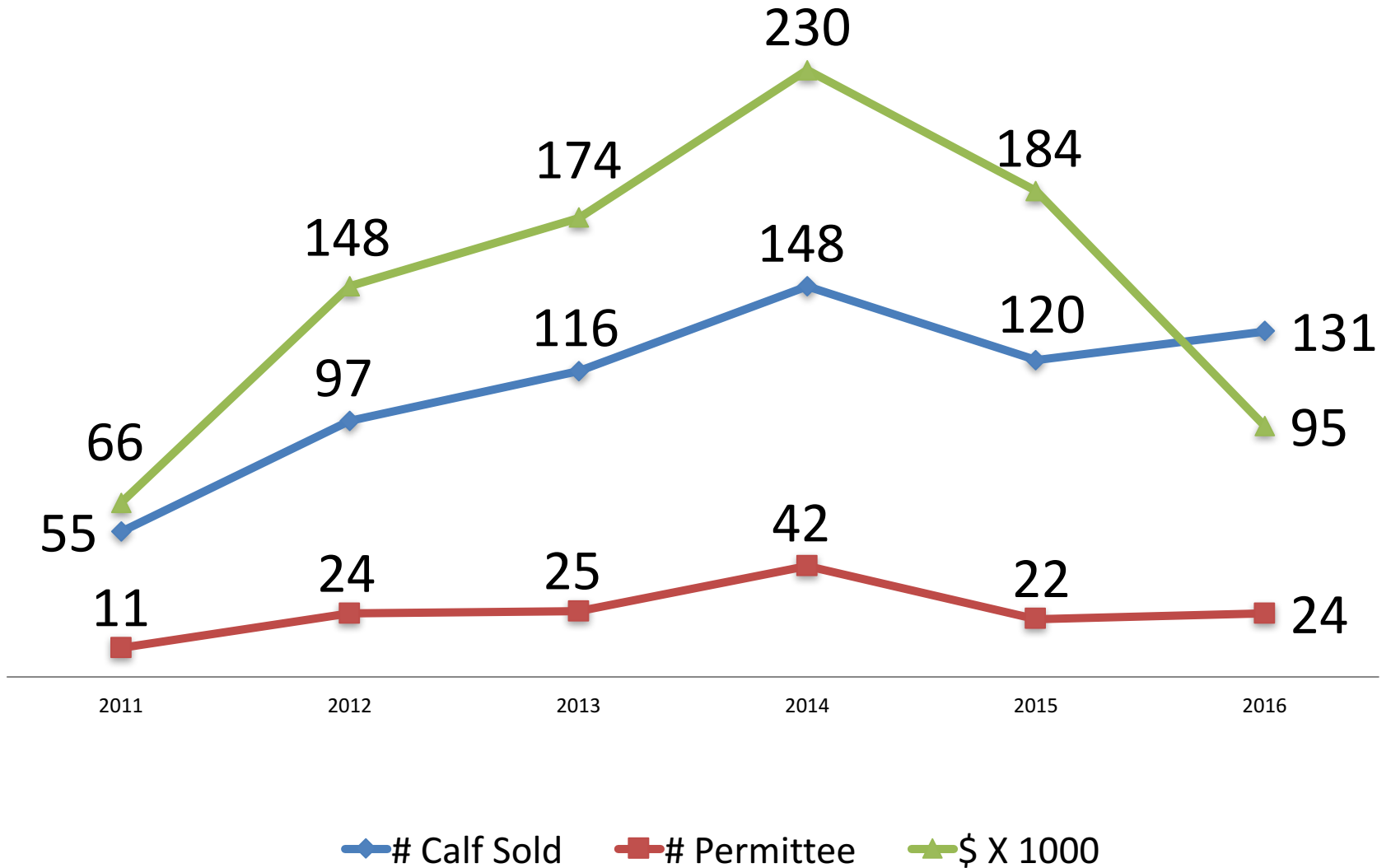
