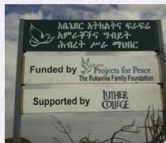

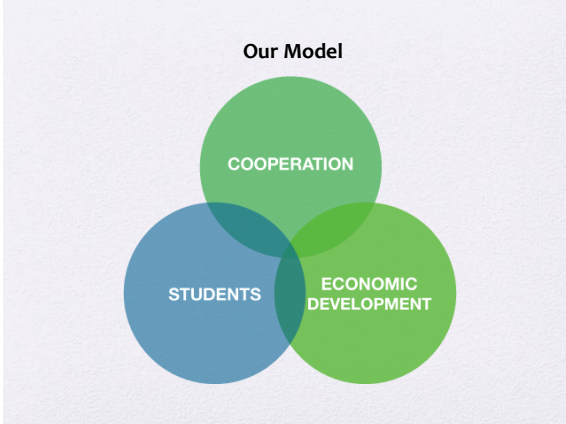

Our Values: Collaboration, Empowerment, Sustainability, Experiential Learning

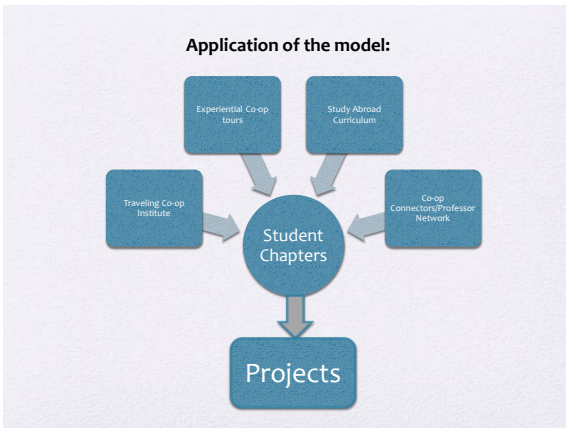
